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

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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE - May 2021

May is usually sunny and warm, with one exception – Track Day! It is nice to see the sunny and warm weather once again!! Two more months and summer will be here!!

Positive COVID Case here in the school – Last week a notice was sent home to all families notifying parents that a person who tested positive for COVID had been in the school. As has been shared with parents, we have put lots of steps in place to keep our students and staff safe. Our school continues to be a safe place and we remain committed to following provincial health guidelines for our students and staff. I would like to thank the parents for their cooperation with regards to isolating and quarantining their children in hopes of reducing the spread.


Track Day – We plan to move our Track Day into June this year. We usually have our track day the second Friday in May to in preparing for the division junior high Track and Field Meet later in May. Since the division meet is cancelled due to COVID we've decided to move out track day into June in hopes that provincial restrictions allow us to have it as we believe it would be such a positive thing for our students.


Parent Council meeting – At our last parent council meeting we talked about the reason for having our front doors locked and why we stopped using classroom microwaves.

A) Locking of the front door – Our School Re-Entry Plan, shared at the beginning of the year, Mentioned that the plan was to keep the front door locked and have parents call the school upon arrival if they were dropping off their child late or picking them up early. This has worked well, given that our office is not close to the door and the provincial expectation that we must screen visitors and ensure they sanitize and wear masks. Most schools have their office close to the front door, not having our office close by means that we cannot see who is coming into the school. To meet government expectations, we installed a doorbell for visitors.

I have heard several concerns from parents about the locked front door and want to work with parents to find a solution that still meets provincial guidelines and expectations.

NEW/CHANGE IN PRACTICE - Once all our students who are quarantining at home return to school (Monday May 10th) we will





- 2. When arriving at the school, please press the doorbell (to let us know in the office that you are coming into the school) and go directly to the office before going anywhere else in the school to let us know who is in the school.
- 3. Make sure you are wearing a mask inside the school.
- 4. Use the hand sanitizer on the wall inside the entryway (bright orange sign).
- 5. Once in the office our secretary will let your child's teacher know you are picking up your child or dropping off a lunch, etc.

IF we are told we have a positive case of COVID in our school and have people quarantined, we will temporarily go back to locking the front door during the required quarantine period. The goal is to reduce the spread and ensure the safety of students and staff.

- If a parent has called the school to meet with a teacher/principal at a specific time, please follow these same steps listed above.
- If you would rather just call the school from your vehicle to pick up your child, please continue with that process (no screening is needed); and we will send your child down to meet you at the doors.



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B) Microwaves - Our School Re-entry Plan mentioned that "Until further notice, no microwaves will be available for students to heat food. Please use alternative forms of food or containers that retain heat."

In our school council meeting I said that some schools allow the use of microwaves. Only 6 (4 junior high/2 elementary) of Horizon's 17 schools let students use a microwave. Eleven schools are not letting students use microwaves as it is one more high touch surface that needs to be cleaned regularly.

Teachers recommended the use of a "thermos" to send a hot lunch with your child. This has helped greatly to provide a warm meal and removed wait times at the microwave as in past years.

As a staff we discussed this issue and feel that it is best to keep things as they are now, with no microwaves. We plan to review this prior to next school year.

At other schools, some parents have been dropping off hot lunches for their children at the front door. At lunch time the students would then go down and pick up their lunch from the table at the front door. If this is some thing that a parent would like to do, we can help with this request and ask that you put your child's name on the lunch.

Masks –are still required by the government for students, teachers, staff, and visitors who enter the school. For our school, students in Grades 3 to 9 are required to only wear their mask on the bus and in the common areas of the school (hallways, bathrooms, walking into and out of classrooms). Students <u>do not</u> have to wear their mask when sitting at their desk. If they are working closely with another student, teachers then remind students to put on their mask. This is not a school rule, rather it is a government rule.

My Thoughts - During this pandemic, COVID has made all our lives more challenging. Our students have adapted well as we look to finish the school year. It has been a year of constant change as guidelines from Alberta Health Services, the Chief Medical Officer of Health, and Alberta Education continue to change as restrictions are reduced or increased. I would like to thank everyone for their support during this school year.

It seems like more updates are constantly happening these days as we are heading in a third wave of the Pandemic as the number of cases of COVID is on the rise once again. We have the month of May and three weeks in June until summer time and I look forward to the day when we no longer will need to wear masks, think about social distancing between all people, worry about hand sanitizing and proper hand hygiene (many times per day), and the ability for everyone to play, grow and get together with their friends and family. I

know that day is coming soon, <u>BUT</u> we are not quite there just yet. Please remember to keep your children, family, school, and community safe by following the rules; when we all work together, the easier it will be in the long run.











