FILL YOUR SHOEBOX

- School Supplies Items such as pens, pencils, pencil crayons, note pads, and picture books
- Hygiene Items Items such as: facecloth, toothbrush, comb, and soap.
- Toys & Other Gifts Items such as: stuffed animals, small musical instruments, hair clips, toy jewelry, t-shirts, and socks
- Personal Note Include a personal note and/or a photo in your shoebox (not inside the donation envelope)

DO NOT INCLUDE:

- Decks of standard playing cards (other card games such as UNO are allowed)
- Food or candy: Including gum (due to customs regulations)
- Used items (due to customs regulations)
- Toothpaste (due to customs regulations)
- Liquids or items that could leak, melt, freeze, or break Shampoo, creams, lip balm, bath gels, mirrors, or glass, etc. (these can damage other items in the shoebox if they leak or break)
- Items that can scare or harm a child War-related toys, knives, and toy guns, etc.



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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE - November 2019

The month of November begins next week and we have a number of activities happening within our school for both students and parents.

We will begin with our Remembrance Day activities that will take place on Tuesday November 10th. Classes will listen to a guest speaker and then will complete some activities within their classroom. Due to COVID guidelines and protocols we are not able to have an assembly this year.

No school for students and staff on Remembrance Day – November 11th.

Students do not have school on Thursday November 12th due to a Division Wide Professional Development Day.



Students do not have school on Friday November 13th due to a School Based Professional Development Day.

On Monday November 16th we will have a couple of student teachers from the University of Lethbridge joining our school. Miss Kari Roth will be joining our Grade 1/2 class and Miss Kendra Berg will be joining our Grade 3/4 class. The student teachers will be here until Thursday December 17th. A big WELCOME to Miss Roth and Miss Berg!

Wednesday November 18th is the day report cards go home with students. These provide information about your child and their progress to date.

Thursday November 19th we have our Parent Teacher Interviews after school that day from 4:00 to 8:00pm. Interviews may be by phone or in-person here at the school. A teacher will be calling parents/families this week to find out your preference with regards to Parent Teacher Interviews. A schedule will be developed and sent home prior to this evening letting parents know what time their interview will take place. All teachers will be in the gym and only ONE parent may visit the school that night. Parents are reminded that they will have to wear a mask from the time they enter the school, during the entire time of their interview, and can take off their mask once they have exited the building. Thank you for your cooperation in advance.

November 24th or 25th our junior high students will be participating in a virtual Skills Exploration Day with the help of Mr. O'Connor.

Monday November 30th is our second ESAC (Enchant School Advisory Council) meeting for all interested parents. The meeting will start at 6:45pm and will be in. Everyone is welcome!

Cold Weather – the past week the cold weather has returned and I would like to remind parents that a good winter coat and a tuque and some mitts/gloves and some boots are the best ways to keep warm. I have seen a few of our students arrive to school in just a hoodie. In my opinion this is not enough to stay warm. ALL of our students go outside at recess 3 times per day for a minimum of 15 minutes and these items will help to keep them warm when they are outside, except for those who will be in the gym one day per week. Please make sure to send your child to school or on the bus with warm clothing. If your family needs some help in this area, please contact Mr. Schmidt at the school and the school will do our best to help!



Reminder for students going home for lunch to remember to bring their masks with them when they return.

Recesses Outside – we have changed our schedule for outside recesses so that students are still cohorted into areas on the playground, but they are a bit closer to the school. We are also making use of the gym and each cohort will get an opportunity to use the gym one day per week. Each cohort is assigned to a specific area of the playground/school – gym, between the main and north doors, part of the front field and flagpole area, the smaller (wooden structure) in the playground, and the larger (metal structure) of the playground. If the temperature gets below

-20°C (temperature wise or in combination with the wind chill) students will stay inside in their class-rooms.

Snow days – just a reminder that when the colder weather comes and there could be a chance of lots of snow, please listen to the radio (CJOC 94.1FM, KissFM 107.7FM, Country 95.5FM, Rock 106FM, B93.3FM) for any school closures that may happen during the school year. The best place to check is the Horizon School Division website (horizon.ab.ca) for the latest updates about school closures. Often information will be made available after 6:30 in the



morning. Check the School Bus icon and it provides information about the school's

bus routes and whether the bus is running or not. Also, the school (actually it's me

Mr. Schmidt) who sends out a message to your home phone, cell phone and/or email using School Messenger.

Absences – Just a reminder to all parents, please keep the school informed if your child or children will be absent. If the school is not notified, then a message will be sent out to you around 9:30am. If you will be going away for a longer amount of time, please let us know so that we can make sure the teachers know and also to make sure it is put in the system so that you do not receive these calls each day.

October 30 - Halloween – Just a reminder to all that Friday October 30th is a regular school day where students will have regular classes. Students are welcomed to wear their Halloween costumes the entire day. A reminder that a costume that has a mask is acceptable to wear at school, but students must also wear a cloth mask underneath. Costume masks will need to be removed during class time (this will be at the discretion of the teacher).

- We also ask that students **do not** bring weapons to school that day as part of their costume (no guns, no knives, no items covered in blood, no scary masks, etc.)
- We are multicultural school where some families may not participate in Halloween activities and we wish to be respectful of all cultures here in our school.
- Some families may choose to keep their children at home on this day. If this is the case, please contact the school to inform the office.

There will be no formal costume parade this year due to COVID restrictions.

SHIRT DAY


