

Principal's Message - December 2021:



December is a festive time of the year where students begin practicing and preparing for two special events. Sadly, again this year due to COVID-19 and the guidelines and protocols and the immense challenges, we will not be having those two events — our German Christmas program and our School Christmas Concert. However, our students have been practicing so that we can provide a virtual Enchant School Christmas Concert once again this year. Thank you to the teachers for their hard work in getting the students ready for this special event. More information will be forthcoming during the last week of school prior to the Christmas break.

Cold Weather/Warm Clothing - The weather the past couple of weeks, of some cool days and some warm days with lots of wind, is a good reminder for parents and students to make sure your child is wearing warm clothing to school. Whether on the bus or walking to school, a good winter jacket will keep your child warm. Toques, mitts/gloves, and boots will also be good as the weather changes to become colder; so, bundle up to stay warm! When my own children went to school. I reminded them often that having a warm coat allows them to stay warm and if they get too warm, they could always take it off. If they did not have a warm coat to put on, then they were cold and could not get warmer.





BUS LANE (DROPPING OFF STUDENTS BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL) — Parents are reminded to use the school parking lot or the area by the mailboxes to drop off their children at the beginning or end of the day. The bus lane is designated just for buses in the morning to provide a safe drop off for students, and then for students to board the bus safely at the end of the day. Best practice would be to use the staff parking lot to the north of the school as it will not interfere with the buses or students when outside at recess times as well. Safety of our students is of utmost importance here at our school. Thank you in advance for your cooperation!!

As principal, I would like to remind everyone to continue with the following COVID-19 guidelines as we near our holiday season:

- Daily self-checks with your children
- Keeping them home from school if they are sick
- Getting them tested for COVID-19 (and letting the school know)
- Following the isolating or quarantining guidelines from Alberta Health Services
- Phoning the school to let us know that your child(ren) will be absent
- Wearing masks in the common areas of the school to protect others
- Following Social Distancing guidelines of 6 feet between us and wearing a mask if we cannot keep that spacing
- Limiting our cohorts to keep our interactions with others to a minimum to keep all of us safe!
- Making great choices to ensure the safety of others and ourselves!!








Early Learning Imagination
