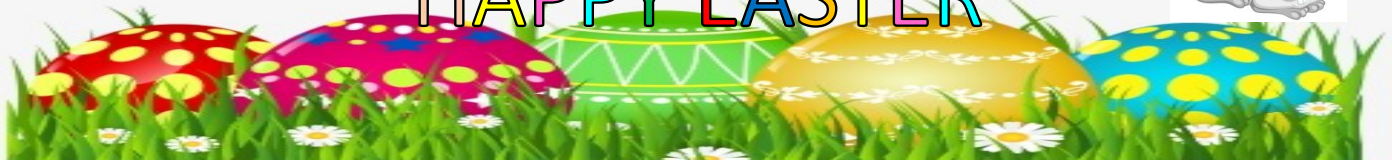

Principal's Message – April 2022

German Easter Program – Tuesday April 13th at 7:00pm the school will be hosting its yearly evening of songs, prayers, and hymns. A very big thank you to Mrs. Susie Neufeld, our German teacher, for all her hard work in preparing the students for this wonderful evening.

Our students have been building picnic benches for the park and in return for their experience, the Park Board will be providing a donation to our Careers and Technology Foundations (CTF) program. A big thank you to our students for providing the labour to complete this project, and to the Park Board for their support of our students!



ESAC – Enchant School Advisory Council – At our meeting on Monday March 28th, parent council was discussing the CASINO fundraiser that our school will be hosting in Lethbridge at some point in either October, November, or December of 2022. Our school will need to provide 8 people per day (4 on the day shift and 4 on the night shift) for 2 days. Each person willing to help out is given a job to do (it is really not hard work, mostly just being there when needed) and while there each person can order food and visit with other people working with them. **Doing this one event, once every three years, provides over \$30,000 to our school to provide programs and opportunities for all our students!** In the past using the money earned the school council has helped to provide new equipment in our gym, new Chromebooks for student use, pay for field trips to various locations, pay for ski trips, Missoula Children’s Theatre experiential week long theatre performances, special guest speakers, special fun events like a science night, and more!! All that is needed is your **help volunteering some time** to work at the casino and the benefits are so many for our students. Please keep this in mind when the new school year (2022-23) begins as the school will be asking for people to help work at the casino. When we all help and work together, it is so much better – better for our school and our community!

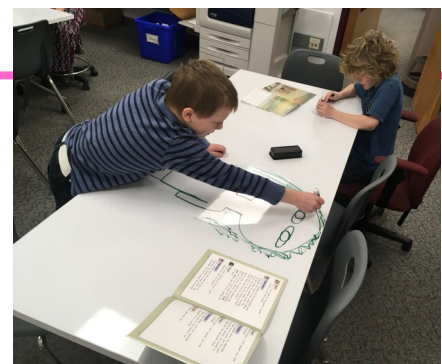
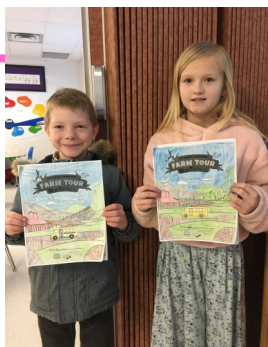
We've also started playing the recorder. I'm so impressed with their progress already! We'll be sharing our talents in a future assembly.

For two of the presentations, we were even able to watch Live and had a chance to ask questions. Our "thank you" made it onto the screen during one of the tours, which was so exciting! Each tour was hosted by a teacher named Coleen, and a farmer who was able to talk about - and show - how his/her farm operates. There were even brain breaks and activities the students could complete in booklets while they watched. Some of the tours included a Sugar Beet Farm in Alberta (they even showed a picture near Enchant!), a Seed Farm in Manitoba, a Pork Farm in Prince Edward Island, Egg Farms in BC & New Brunswick, and a Fish Farm in Ontario. Our biggest challenge was the Maple Syrup Farm in Quebec because the tour was in French. This meant we had to do a little extra research to answer our brain break question. The kids have really enjoyed the whole experience! As an additional fun fact from the month of March, a few of the grade 3/4 students were able to represent characters and dialogue from a story they'd read using the whiteboard tables-- how fun!





Jr High Growth

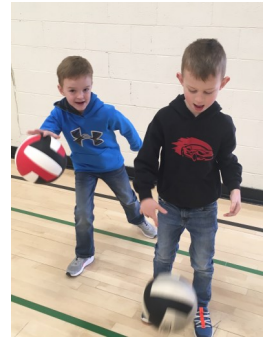
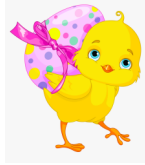

Early Learning Amusement

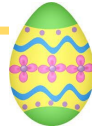
