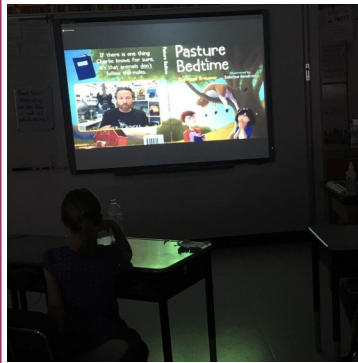


# Harvest Supper Fun

And of course, recesses wouldn't be complete without some good games of ping-pong to enjoy!



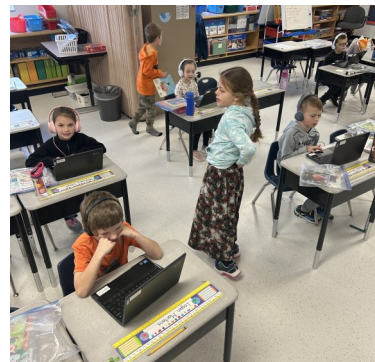
## *Early Learning*

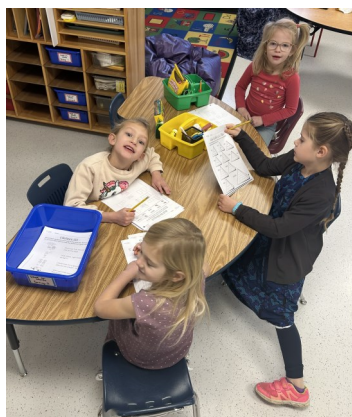
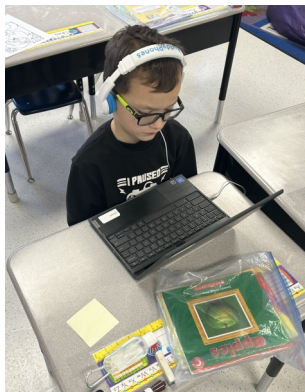
