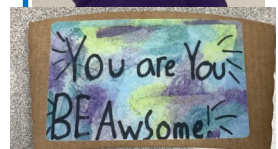

## Kindergarten

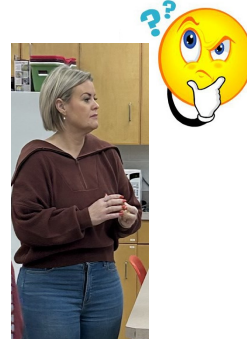
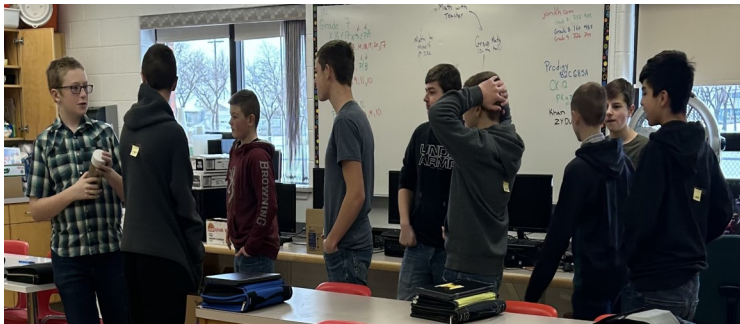

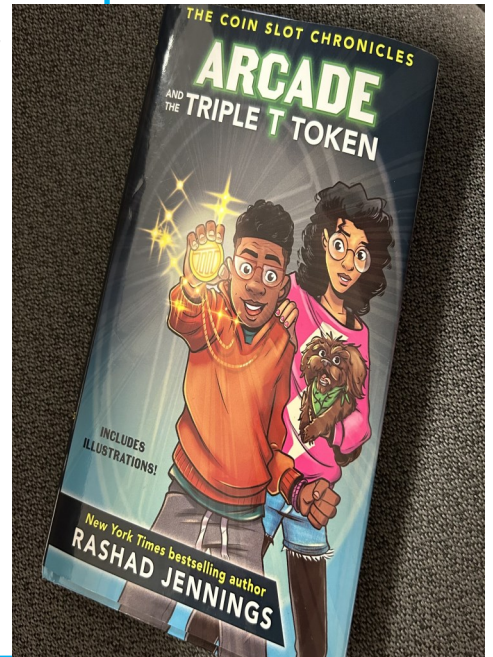




## Grade 3/4
