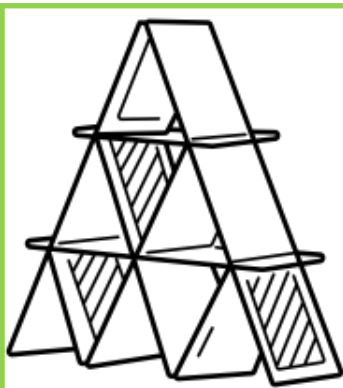

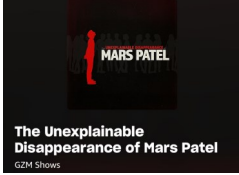

This last month has flown by. During April we explored the many possibilities of spring. We played in the dirt and sticks, seeing how they all help our environments to grow. Afterward, we planted our plants and we enjoyed watching them grow. Four plants are growing so far, this has been a great opportunity for the children to take care of their plant each day. Pre-k has enjoyed more messy play opportunities to engage with their peers and loves making many different types of food in the dramatic play. As the weather gets warmer we will transition to more outdoor activities. During longer periods of outdoor time, the children can explore more possibilities and revisit ideas of play.



Grade 5/6 students have been busy learning to build and code their own Mars rovers in Science class. Everyone was engaged and so proud to watch their "creations" come to life. What a great learning experience! We have also started to hone our listening comprehension skills by listening to the podcast "The



Unexplainable Disappearance of Mars Patel". It's a mystery we are hoping to solve by Episode 10 by listening for clues. The

Enrichment class built Lego islands that were pounded by one disaster after another. Most students were able to make adjustments to their island to ward off many of the disasters like an approaching hurricane or thieves and zombies.



Kindergarten has discussed ALL the letters of the alphabet! We are starting to blend letter sounds and trying to read some short vowel words. We have been trying to print words in our journal by listening for more than one sound in a word. In math, we are starting some measurement concepts using non-standard units. Spring stories, discussions of sights and scenes and movement of animals in spring has been focussed on this past month. We certainly enjoyed our trip to the swimming pool and thankful to all who were able to help out to make that trip possible for us. Kindergarten's year end field trip is temporarily planned for near the end of May to the Birds of Prey in Coaldale and the Color Me Mine studio in Lethbridge. Details will be sent out in the coming few weeks.



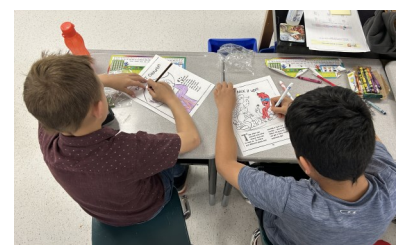
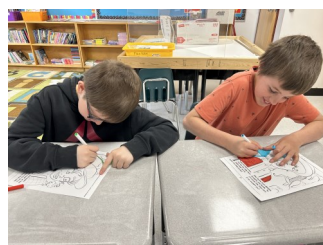
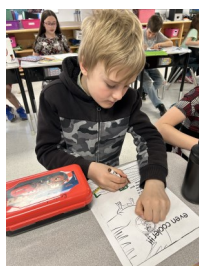
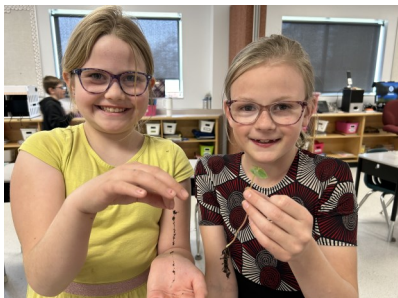
