Hi I am Emily-rose from grade 5/6, here to tell you about what has been going on in our class. This month we made art projects for the harvest supper. We made pumpkins out of books and we made angels out of wire. In Enrichment we made catapults and we had a contest to see who could launch a candy pumpkin the farthest. We started learning about ancient Athens in Social. We learned about how they started democracy and the Olympics. Our class built tinfoil boats in Science to learn about buoyancy. In art we made portraits in the style of Tim Burton. They are hanging in the hall. Come have a look!



In October I have been observing a lot of dizzy play. In dizzy play, children interact and express large forms of play through language, drama, and full-body exploration. The children have gotten into a routine, allowing them to dive deeper into play and create playful expressions of their learning. Over this past month, we have talked about pumpkins and the many properties of them, where they grow and who grows them. The children are looking forward to explore even further with our hands-on exploration. They have explored building stores, creating animal farms, and a lot of broken-down semis that needed fixing.



So many students in the Jr. High room are avid readers. They check out books at school, and many frequently visit the local library over lunch break. Miss Cummings also brought two boxes filled with books for the classroom, and their arrival was a hit! Note: there may or may not have even been a student who smelled a book delivered to them. <giggle giggle> Bookworms, unite!



The 3/4 students had so much fun creating artwork for the Fall Supper art sale. One of their fave projects was making sets of Christmas cards. They learned all about the wonderful world of cardmaking including maintaining even borders, clustering, and what ephemera & sentiments are. They took their time to match colours carefully and even added dimension! The students were so excited many didn't want to sell the cards (which was okay since we had other projects to select from). They should be extremely proud of the craftsmanship shown in the cards and ALL their artwork! The 3/4's completed a group poster project after reading *The Wild Robot*. They worked amazingly with their team to showcase all they'd learned about the story. This class is absolutely WILD for *The Wild Robot*!



The grade one class has had a very busy October! Everyone had a lot of fun making art projects for the Harvest Supper. The class has been reading simple words and pattern stories. In math we are exploring numbers to 20 and the kids have been showing numbers in different ways. We have finished our science unit about the four seasons and the class had a great time making projects with leaves. In social studies, the class has been busy learning about belonging and discussing all the different places where they feel safe. We are looking forward to having a student teacher from the University of Lethbridge in the classroom, Mr. Conner McCaughtrie will be joining us in November.



Wow, it's the end of October! Kindergarten had great fun making the "patch work quilt" pumpkins for the harvest supper and we hope you enjoyed seeing them as much as we liked making them. Thanks for your support. Kindergarten has been diligently learning about 2D shapes and numbers to 8 this month in math. We have been looking at objects and sorting them by attribute. In language learning, we continue to learn letters and associate words to beginning sounds.



The Grade 2's first mystery reader came to visit in October. Throughout the week they were given clues about our reader and got to guess who they thought it was. At the end of the week Constable Kennedy Gallant read a story to us and answered questions about being a police officer. After answering all of their questions the grade 2's got to sit in the drivers seat or the back seat of the police truck and hear the sirens!
