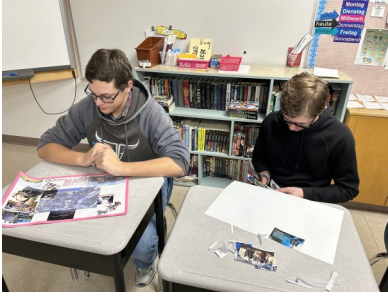

This month Jr High students completed personal reflection booklets, discussed the importance of setting reasonable goals, and created their own 2025 Vision Boards.

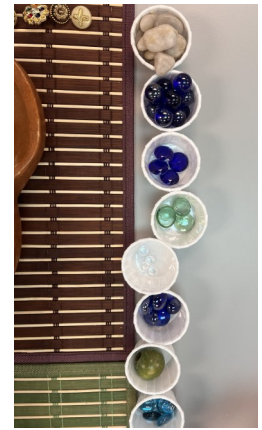
A vision board is a tool that can be used for long-term planning and to motivate you to achieve major life goals.
