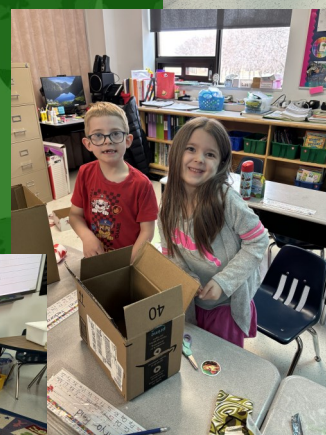

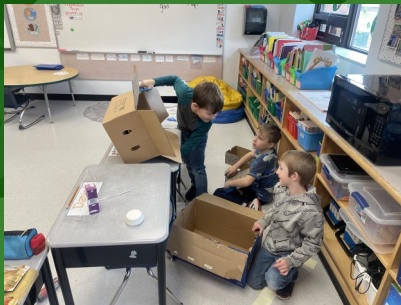
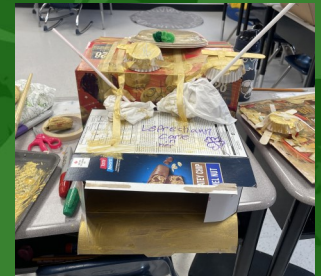
Jr Highs field trip to the E3 Trades Workshop was a great way to expose our students to some of the different career paths that they may be interested in the future.



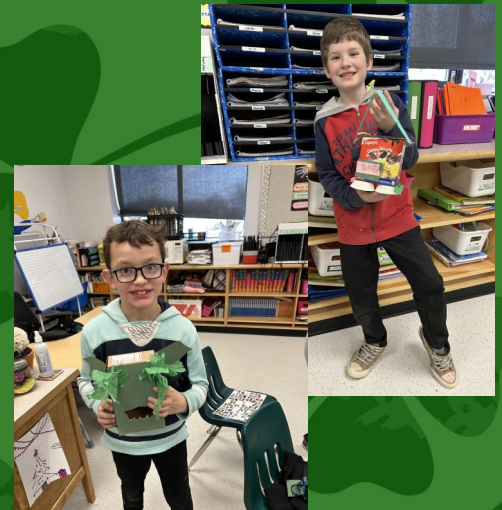

We have been working on numbers to 100 and skip counting. Exploring the idea of the "past" is the next topic in social studies. Hard to believe Easter is around the corner!

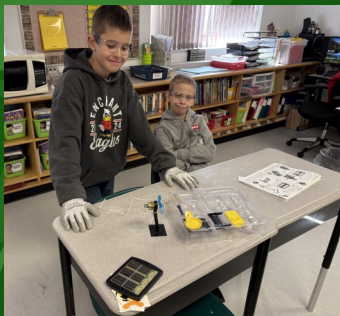

We will finish learning the letters of the alphabet which will allow us to put letters together to try to build some short vowel words as well as learn about digraphs. In math, we will continue to do some measurement activities for the next couple of weeks. We have been enjoying our next round of show and tell as students bring in items that are special to them.



The grade fives and sixes have put much time and effort into improving their writing skills this month. They have also made posters highlighting renewable energy and flowcharts outlining the 3 branches of the Alberta government. They have learned about one point perspective and celebrated Pi Day by making radials using the first 36 numbers of Pi. 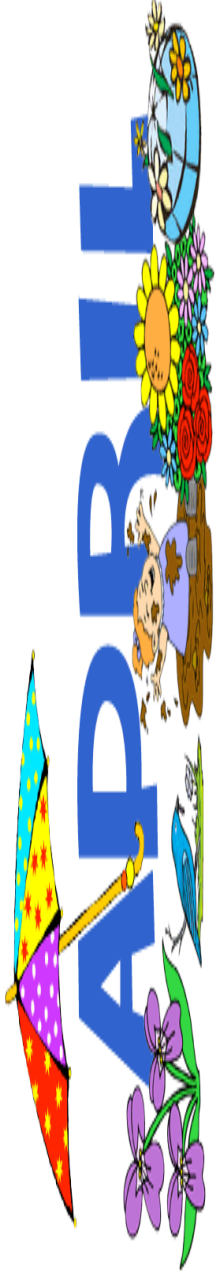
